THE INVENTION OF 'DYNASTY' BETWEEN GLOBAL INTELLECTUAL HISTORY AND POLITICAL ECONOMY

Scholars often take 'dynasty' for granted and treat it as a given reality (conceptual and institutional), associated with monarchies across time and space. This paper uncovers and criticises this standard view by using the framework of global intellectual history. Ultimately, problematizing and historicizing 'dynasty' helps us to reconceptualise the interplay between the history of concepts and political economy from the late middle ages to the nineteenth century.
