



Emotions and Modernity in Colonial India



Modernity for long has been viewed as a process which went along with an increasing control over emotions – whether this control was regarded as linked to capitalism, to the modern bureaucratic state or interpreted as a process through which external control mechanisms moved inside the subject. However, drawing on the aftermath of riots in Kanpur in 1913 and relating them to psychological writings in Urdu, I would argue in this talk that the actors not only reflected more on their emotions, but also increasingly valued strong, visceral and even indomitable passions.
